After School Activity Clubs - Final List

We are so lucky to be able to offer so many after school clubs for our children next term. I would like to thank those people who have volunteered to run these after school opportunities. We have three new clubs this term, read the descriptions and see which group your child wants to join.

Monday -

<u>Football</u> - all year groups - Ryan the football coach from Banbury United leads the group in warm ups, skills and game tactics. Being outside and using the full sized pitch is really important for this after school activity. The children take part in this club at the pavilion.

Tuesday -

<u>Dance club</u> - all year groups - This vibrant and energetic club involves the children learning steps for dances, fun games and a mini production at the end of the term. Emma uses songs and music (Encanto and Space Jam). The children love it and really it inspires them to enjoy dance.

Wednesday -

<u>Craft club</u> - Year 5 and 6 (Rowan) - Craft club is a chance for the children to express their inner crafter or artist. We use different materials each week to create beautiful items which the children take home. It is lovely to see how proud they are of the things they make each week. It is my intention with the older

children for them to learn new craft/Art and Design skills such as paper making including making the tools they need to complete this project. It is a relaxed and friendly atmosphere and the children really enjoy it.

Thursday -

<u>Forest Arts and Crafts</u> (Inside forest school) - Year EYFS-Year 4 (Orchard, Oak & Willow) - This is a chance for the children to be creative using natural resources and bring the outside in. Donna feels it is a bit too cold for Forest School Club this term so she will be carrying out similar activities but inside. There might even be hot chocolate and marshmallows!

<u>Multi-skills sports club</u> - Keystage 1 (Orchard & Oak) - Mr Runcorn will be teaching the children ball skills that could be used in lots of sports. The children will spend lots of time running around and there will be the opportunity to play mini games at the end of the sessions. The children will need PE kits for the sessions.

Friday -

<u>Science club</u> - Keystage 2 (Willow & Rowan) - Science Club: As part of science club each week we will investigate a different area of biology, chemistry, or physics by creating fun experiments to test our hypothesis or by making interactive models to demonstrate scientific principles. Will any of the solvents and solutes go up with a bang? Whose plant will grow the best? We will find out!

All clubs cost £27.00 for the six-week block. You will be able to book these clubs on Parent Pay from 5.00pm tonight.

For next term we are going to ask that children sign up to sessions for the whole term i.e. 6 weeks (similar to how swimming lessons are booked). The clubs will be live on ParentPay later this afternoon and will need to be booked by Friday 18th February at the latest – we will not be accepting any more children into the clubs after this date. This allows us to properly staff and resource these activities.

If you would like financial support in paying for the block of sessions, please let me know. If your child does not wish to continue with a club after starting, unfortunately we cannot issue refunds for that term.

'Hang out club' can be booked in advance via ParentPay if you know what sessions you will need, with the cut-off point being midnight on Thursday for the following week's sessions. We understand that there are circumstances where you may have to book a child in at the last minute, in these cases please contact the office by email or phone.

Rugby Workshop-Ignite



Additionally, we have been building up to writing our own poetry about heroes. Willow Class

In Willow this week, we have been finalising our non-chronological reports showcasing our learning on Volcanoes. The children have all worked extremely hard on these and I cannot wait to see you all on the HPS website. In Maths, they have been multiplying -2-, -3- and -4- digit numbers using both the short and long method of multiplication. The resilience has been incredible! We finished our Geography learning by analysing the effects of natural habitats on the world and how geothermal energy has helped Iceland, and other countries, use a more renewable source. Finally, in Science we have been using the thermometers to measuring the temperature of water over a period of time and recording our observations on its change in state. Well done Willow!



Rowan Class This week in Rowan class has been action-packed. We have begun working on our persuasive speech writing in English, and we have completed our maths unit on percentages which has been tricky but the whole class have shown great resilience. In science we've been getting very hands-on with experiments this week. Our first experiment involved testing the flammability of different materials to find out which would be the safest to make a HPS PE kit with! Our second experiment involved building circuits and testing out which materials can be used as conductors of electricity, and which materials are good insulators. Finally, we covered the importance of canals during the industrial revolution in geography, and tried our hand at creating some William Morris-inspired Victorian wallpaper in art!
