TEACHER INDUSTRIAL ACTION

You may be aware from media coverage that the NEU (National Education Union) have declared strike action, which will take place on Thursday the 2nd of March (as has been previously shared further dates are planned for the 15th and 16th of March). Staff members are not required to inform us of their decision to strike, however, the class teachers have chosen to let me know their intentions. Therefore, I am writing to inform you that Oak, Willow and Rowan Class will be closed on Thursday the 2nd of March. We are asking you not to send your child into school on this day.

We will be operating a class for vulnerable children (children who are in receipt of Pupil Premium funding or have an EHCP) and children of Critical Key Workers. I understand that this situation may be frustrating, and ask that all members of our school community continue to treat each other with respect. A national strike by teachers is very unusual. Those on strike will have thought long and hard about their decision and will also lose pay for the days that they are on strike. We are working closely with our staff union members to keep up to date with the situation, and I will inform you as soon as possible if arrangements change further. Our Nursery and EYFS class are unaffected and will be open for children who usually attend on Thursdays.

We are aware that this is World Book Day, so instead of dressing up on this day we will come to school as our favourite book character as part of Hornton Primary School Book Festival on the 19th of June. During this week we will be celebrating with visiting authors, dressing up, and publishing our own book of poems.

Refunds will be given if clubs are cancelled on strike days.
