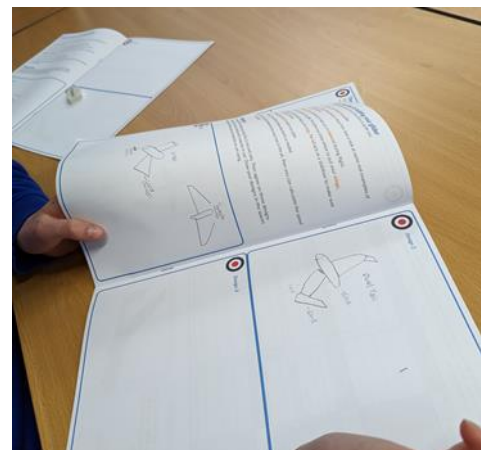
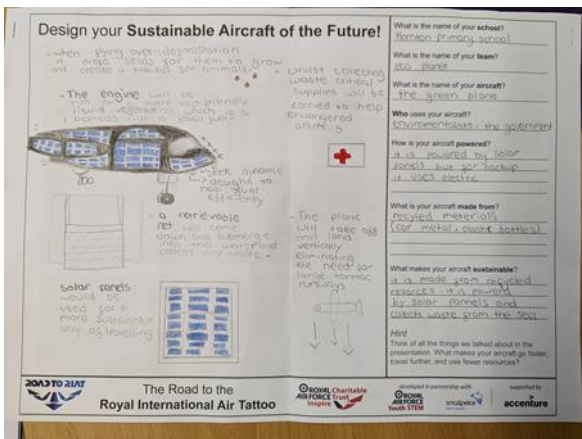


Reading with your child
