## **TEACHER INDUSTRIAL ACTION**

You may be aware from media coverage that the NEU (National Education Union) have declared strike action, which will take place on Wednesday and Thursday the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16th of March. Staff members are not required to inform us of their decision to strike, however, the class teachers have chosen to let me know their intentions. Therefore, I am writing to inform you that Oak, Willow and Rowan Class will be closed on Wednesday and Thursday the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16th of March. We are asking you not to send your child into school on this day.

We will be operating a class for vulnerable children (children who are in receipt of Pupil Premium funding or have an EHCP) and children of Critical Key Workers. I understand that this situation may be frustrating, and ask that all members of our school community continue to treat each other with respect. A national strike by teachers is very unusual. Those on strike will have thought long and hard about their decision and will also lose pay for the days that they are on strike. We are working closely with our staff

union members to keep up to date with the situation, and I will inform you as soon as possible if arrangements change further. Our Nursery and EYFS class are unaffected and will be open for children who usually attend on Wednesday and Thursdays.

**Science Week** - Hornton Primary's science week will run from 13<sup>th</sup> to the 18<sup>th</sup> March and pupils throughout the school will be able to have hands-on experience of the wide and varied fields of science. The children across the school will be taking part in three science competitions involving Art, photography and investigations. We will share the work we have completed next week.

**Hadsham Farm** - Hornton School Visit to Hadsham Farm - Wednesday the 29<sup>th</sup> of March. We are so excited to take the children to visit the Farm. The Taylor family have kindly given us a reduced rate of £3 per child and the PTA have generously donated the cost of the coach. This will be available on ParentPay from Monday afternoon, so please give permission for your child to attend by Friday 24<sup>th</sup> of March.

We would like the children to be taken to the farm at 9.00am instead of being brought to school – please drop them off in the car park opposite the farm (it will be signposted 'lambing car park') and then they can be guided across the road together. The tour will finish at 11.30am and a coach will bring the children back to school. Lunch will be served as normal.

Please ensure your child/children are dressed in old clothes with wellington boots. They will need to bring a change of shoes in a bag. For those children who usually attend Breakfast club on a Tuesday, it will still go ahead and they will be taken to the farm by Mrs Whitehouse. Parents do not need to accompany their children and Nursery children will get the opportunity to visit the farm when they are in Reception.

We currently have cases of conjunctivitis and impetigo in the school.
