Threadworms - We have received information that there are threadworms present in the school. Threadworms, also known as pinworms, are tiny worms found in faeces. They are quite common in children and can be easily spread. You do not need to see a GP to treat them as treatment can be purchased from a chemist. The NHS website offers a lot of information about this condition, which can be very helpful if your child is showing any symptoms of threadworm or if you are concerned in any way.


