#### **Freshstart- New School Meal Provider**

As you may know, we have decided to move away from our current catering provider from Term 5. We have chosen a local company called Fresh Start Catering, and they provide school lunches in many schools around Oxfordshire. Andrew Howarth and Kate Quinn from Fresh Start will be running a tasting session on Monday, 25th March, from 3:00pm in school, where there will be food samples for you to taste from the school lunch menu. Please make a note in your diary and come along to find out more about the food Fresh Start will be providing.

On Monday, we will send home a letter with a unique ID and Password to set up an account within Meal Manager.

Meals and payment are coordinated on Fresh Start's website. Can you please register your parent account and claim your children with the Pupil ID and password provided on your welcome letter. You WILL NOT see your child on the dashboard until the menu for Term 5 is set live. This will hopefully be set live in the next week of this term ahead of the Easter holiday. Can you please activate your account by Friday, this will allow any issues with logging in to be ironed out before the holidays when the school will be closed. Fresh Start is not able to discuss a child's account with a "parent" over the phone or via personal email if you have not claimed your child to a registered parent account for safeguarding reasons.

I know it will take some adjusting for parents (and children); however, I am confident in the range of food being offered and the fresh home-cooked menu provided by the Fresh Start team.

**Hornton Village Church** has invited the children to a number of services over the last year, and we are delighted to have been invited back to the Village Sunday Service on Sunday. This is a 45-minute family-friendly service that runs for the people of the village once a month and the church would like to extend its welcome to everyone.

All the children have been warmly invited to sing two songs they have been learning in their music lessons, which carry a positive and uplifting message. Some students have been asked to share some drama work as well. We will have the opportunity to practice these on Friday, March 22nd, during the school day.
