Covid 19 in School Update

You will all be aware that Covid-19 restrictions ended on 24 February 2022 and we have now moved to the stage of 'Living with Covid'. The full range of advice for living with COVID-19 can be found here

As a school (Within the Warriner Multi Academy Trust), we will be continuing to follow the government guidance. Following this guidance is essential if we are all to play our part in protecting the health and well-being of all members of our school community. 'Living with Covid' does not mean that it is now acceptable for children or staff to be in school if they have tested positive. Although the rules around self-isolation are no longer statutory, the guidance from the government is clear that anyone who tests positive should stay at home and avoid other people.

Below is the information taken from a document shared by OCC (3/3/22)


UKHSA advice contains the following statements regarding attendance at school

"Children and young people with COVID-19 should not attend their education setting while they are infectious. They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these tests results are negative, they should return to their educational setting if they normally attend one, as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature. If your day 5 LFD test result is positive, you can continue taking LFD tests until you receive 2 consecutive negative test results."

Welcoming children back to school

In most cases, parents and carers will agree that a pupil with the key symptoms of COVID-19 should not attend the school, given the potential risk to others.

If a parent or carer insists on a pupil attending your school where they have a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19, you can take the decision to refuse the pupil if, in your reasonable judgement, it is necessary to protect other pupils and staff from possible infection with COVID-19.
