If you or your child has a threadworm infection, it is not necessary to stay off school. However, it's important to inform school so that they can take steps to limit the spread of infection.

**Parking** - As we all know, we have limited parking available in the immediate vicinity of the school. Even so, it is imperative that we continue to park with respect to the residents of Hornton and their right of way to their homes. There is ample parking availability at the Pavilion, from where it is a short and pleasant walk to the school.
